**Work Party on Saturday 31st October at 10.00.**

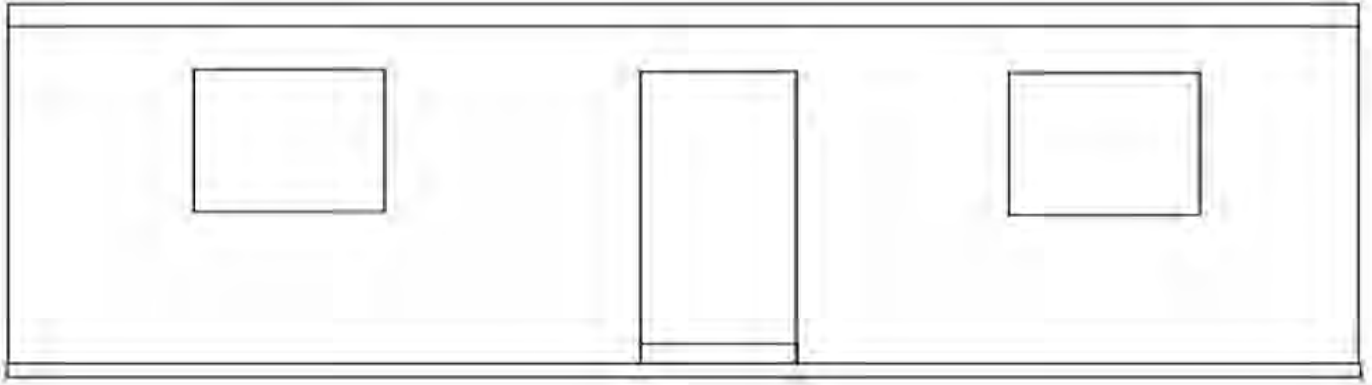
Halloween this year is being marked with a work party to carry out some essential works that have been allowed to build as we were unsure about our tenure.

## Membership Fees Set to Increase.

The last year has been one of uncertainty and worry about the future at Harefield. Chairman Mat has contacted virtually all members either by phone or e mail over the last weeks. He's been trying to gauge the appetite for a fee increase to cover the rent that we are now going to pay for the next five years.

There will be an increase at the next AGM to  
Adults £120 (an increase of £35)  
Junior £47 (an increase of £15)  
Social Members £32 (no change)

### Plus your BMFA fee.

We will introduce the option of half year payments but the BMFA will have to be paid in full.

### Thursday 10th December Annual General Meeting at the Battle of Britain Club.

Personally I would love to be able to leave some wings at the field, I'd probably not leave the more expensive fuselage with its receiver, engine and bits but I'd risk leaving the Wot 4 wings with its single servo. Have a think and we'll be asking about it at the AGM.
