## PLUGGED INTO THE SUN AGAIN



The club's solar panel, bolted into place on the club house roof to trickle charge the 12 volt batteries powering the club house's internal lights, was stolen by marauders at Harefield only four weeks after its installation. A new panel was swiftly purchased and fitted to an A-frame so that it can be deployed at ground level on each flying day. First arrivals at the field are required to set up the panel (it takes two—it is not light) on the grass at the end of the club house, facing the car park. A cement block has been let into the ground, to which the panel can be attached (see picture on the right), using the bungee luggage straps attached to the panel. It must be dismounted and stored away at the end of the day by the last two members to leave. DO NOT LEAVE IT OUT OVERNIGHT.
