Work Party 19th Saturday March.

Last year we had the area out to the right of the field all cleared by tractor. This exposed some concrete and reinforcing bar that has been dumped over the years. We need to collect all this and throw it all in a convenient hole that is already out there. By clearing these obstructions, we can get a slightly smaller tractor to return and cut the weeds later in the year, at the moment these obstructions would break the smaller tractor.

We also need to apply some lawn sand to the AstroTurf which will kill the moss.

To help the access from the pits to the runway we've bought some ground reinforcement mesh that needs laying.

The new Club roof has some exposed wood that needs painting too.

So, there is plenty to do at the field, please turn up and help, the more the merrier. It starts at 10 in the morning and we'll supply a hearty lunch of soup, bread and cheese to finish.

Needless to say, there will be no flying while the work party is ongoing.

A New Season Starts.

After the Winter lay off with very little flying, please make sure that you give your airframes, electronics and batteries a really good check before flying. All sorts of things can go wrong after a long period in storage so don't send the model into the air without a good check.

This may include getting the radio system checked by the manufacturer or an agent.

Please make sure that you range check your plane too, we're going to have a bit of a safety drive on this. Whilst you're at it, ensure a fail safe is set on the model too. There will be spot checks to ensure that we are all doing our bit to keep it safe.
