David Orrells Project's - The fighter is a kit from Warbird Replicas, it's an La-7 plane, it's made from obeche skinned parts with foam cut wings. I glassed the model and then Mat painted it for me. I've got a new Laser 80 four stroke engine to power it. The model has electric retracts but no flaps. It had its first flight without the cowl so I could adjust the engine, I then removed some lead and re-balanced it with the cowl and flew it again. It flew really well with only minor trim adjustment. It had a minor problem with one oleo upon landing and as the light was so poor on Saturday, I decided to sort out the oleo before flying it again.

The red and white model is a Hanger 9 kit called a Pulse 40. This has got a Laser 70 engine. I picked the model up second hand and it's been a great buy. It flies really well and is a simple, everyday plane. The cowl won't fit over the Laser but this just makes access even easier.
