<u>Indoor Flying</u>- There was three of us who attended the first Saturday at Wycombe's indoor flying. Mathew, Kevin and Myself. We turned up armed with indoor planes, helicopters and some small drones.

We had a good supply of batteries to last us to the end. This was well worth the £10 to be flying in the warm and with no wind.

The Wycombe Club have again invited us to join them for their indoor flying sessions at the Wycombe Sports Centre, dates and other relevant information as follows.

Flying fees are £10/session.

The multi-storey carpark next to the main entrance will be open (it was closed for the previous sessions but is now open), the tariff is 50p for 2 hours payable only with coins.

The Park & Ride carpark is also available but now charges £1.20 for 4 hours, this can be paid for by card.

<u>CAA Operator ID Reminder</u> — By now most of us have placed our ID on our models. If you are bringing a model out that has not been used for a while, please remember to check it has your current ID, clearly labelled in accordance to the CAA instructions.

<u>Filming at Stockers farm update</u> – A reminder that filming at Stockers has stopped since Friday the 1^{st} October so there will be no more disruptions for the rest of 2021.

<u>Pickeridge Farm Update</u> — Unfortunately, the EHA (Environmental Health), one of the consultees for the local authority, has had a look at our recently submitted noise assessment and decided that they are still recommending the refusal of our application. This means we will need to submit a revision of the noise assessment and provide some further clarification of the club's proposed "mitigations" (type of models flown, number in the air, operating times etc), these both taking into account the latest observations of the EHA's response. We are now consulting with those "in the know" and would hope to have this ready by mid-November. Again, more waiting, but the planning officer ideally needs the EHA to have no objections before completing his report ahead of the planning committee meeting that we will eventually have to go before.

Car Racing Update (from TP) - Despite starting very late in the year, the last few months have seen some brilliant, well attended car race evenings. However, as there's a marked lack of enthusiasm for running under floodlights there'll be no more evening racing until the clocks once aging move forward in the New Year. As a good many of the people I've spoken to have no intention of parking their cars up for the next five or six months I propose we run at the weekends. Sunday mornings to be more precise. Quite how often is yet to be decided but it'll probably be once or twice a month. As we move into the time of year when the weather is at best unpredictable rather than run on specific dates the decision to run will be made depending on the weather and overall enthusiasm. While this might mean we could easily go three or weeks with no four-wheel action we could just as easily run two Sundays back-to-back. The decision to run will be made no later than Friday morning and you'll be notified by email. No email automatically means it's not on. At this point in time the dirt track is perfectly useable, as is obviously enough, the Astroturf.

However, and this is very important, we are a model flying club and propellers trump wheels. What that means is that if we're running on the Astroturf and someone turns up to fly, we'll have to move. Finally, I think it's worth reminding people that the dirt track can be used by any club member (running an electric car) at any time. Just because nothing formal's been arranged doesn't mean you have to stay away.

TB Tuning- (They call him Mr Tony Nitro) Ok, so we've had a great year flying our IC models but now it's time to set them up for the lean winter months, to help protect the bearings and stop the carbs from seizing up. Quite simple really, put some oil down the carbs on all twostrokes about a teaspoon will suffice, flick it over a couple of times shut the carb and if you really want to go the whole hog point/ store the model forward, so the oil gets to the bearings. Turn the engine over a couple of times every three to four weeks. Fourstrokes are slightly different, squeeze the same amount of oil into the crankcase breather pipe and a couple of drops into the cylinder head through the plug hole. Turn engine over a couple of times every three to four weeks. Hope this helps, look forward to seeing your engines next year. TB Tuning signing off for 2021!
