lan White's Revived 35-year-old Plane.





I asked in for some information on this restored Plane.

Hi Graham, it was modified from a David Boddington design that I built 35 years ago. It has been in my loft for the last 30 years. it had deteriorated considerably so required stripping and recovering in Oratex. The red and the yellow colours were sprayed with B&Q emulsion sample pots. Originally powered by an OS40 four stroke, it now flies on a 25-size electric motor and 3300 3s lipo's. He actually resurrected it so he could take it to Pickeridge and fly it there. Thanks for your story.

A lesson learnt, by Dave Orrells.

Many years ago, when my sone Charlie was flying model planes he bought this Seagull Tucano and I installed a Saito four stroke 21cc petrol engine. He flew it a few times, declared it underpowered and stopped flying it. He eventually stopped flying models and I bought it from him. I promptly hung it up in the loft and left it.

However, over the last couple of weeks I got it out and repaired all the bits that needed fixing. I checked over the batteries and replaced them in the end. I took the engine out and Tony B kindly checked it over and got it running. I re-installed the engine and bought it to the field on Saturday 4th March. We eventually got it to run (I had the throttle reversed) and I committed it to the air.

The first flight was fine, Mat was my trimming buddy and we soon had it hands free and flying straight and level. I landed it and reduced the over sensitive ailerons and fitted the cowl. The second flight was uneventful and not underpowered at all. I tried a loop, which I had also completed on the second flight, this is where it went wrong. I became disorientated at the top; the plane had rolled as it climbed and came drifted towards the flight line. The end result was that I was unable to work out which input I needed, and it came straight down, inches beyond the flight line. So, it crashed the correct side of the line.

The plane is totalled but the engine seems okay as the ground was very soft. It needs checking over as the front pushrod guides are bent, we don't know about the pushrods themselves. I'll strip it down and check everything.

The retracts seem okay too.

So, what lessons are learnt?

Don't fly in poor light with a camouflaged plane or keep the manoeuvres simple is the main one. How not to become disoriented is harder but I'm sure the poor light contributed to the crash. Whose fault was that? Mine, pilot error is the answer. Still, no-one was hurt and it's only a toy plane after all. The engine performed very well and sounded great so I'll repair it come what may.
