#### TBT (Tony Bloomfield Tuning) Monthly Tips.

Glow plugs, don't take them for granted, if your engine is hard to start and you have to up the tick over to make it reliable, the chances are the plug is not 100%. Replace it with a new one and see if there is any difference, if not then put the new plug back in the packet and put the original one back in. The problem lies somewhere else. The plug should be shiny, and the coil should be nice and round, you can connect the glow start to the plug to see if it works but that doesn't tell you how good it is under load.

#### Warbirds Replicas FW 190 Butcher Bird.

This is David's Warbirds Replica's FW 190, a short kit that he received for Christmas. It's electric powered by a 4s 3000 Li-po battery and is a basic, no-frills short kit. A short kit means that it includes laser cut frames, canopy, cowl and bits together with foam wings finished in obechi (or similar) WR advocate covering in cheap brown paper and PVA glue, then emulsion Match Pots for paint.

David glassed the plane, just because he could and then sprayed it with Tamiya paints with an airbrush, another Christmas present!

Richard Wills runs Warbird Replicas but with fewer and fewer customers as foamy models have



taken most of the trade. He therefore designed and cut this virtually to order. He wrote a thread on the RCM&E forum under the title The Big Question, then invited people to agree to buy them before cutting a limited run of 25 kits. He's keen to encourage more people building rather than buying foamies, hence this simple to build kit.

The plane launches off a dolly and belly lands, no flaps, no retracts to worry about. The kit sold for £150, the motor was £25, and it has a 50-amp ESC. It uses smallish servos that he already had rather than buying new. The plane flies very well and had its first outing with the dolly in the sun on Saturday 30th March. The next one in the series is a Typhoon and there's a thread on that on the forum too. He builds it first and adds photos that we can then use to build, a picture worth a thousand word and all that.

### Mat Dawson's Blackburn Firecrest.

Most of you know Mat's Firecrest, he's designed, laser cut and built this model from scratch. It had its first flight the other day, a true success!

The plane is powered by a Laser 100 and weights 9.5 lbs with a 60" wingspan.



It is still not finished, there are insignia and markings yet to be added. This was a first flight to make sure it actually flies.

Even better news is that he's been selected as reserve to represent the UK in the World Scale Championships in Romania later in the year.
