The Entrance Gate

As was reported before, the gate lock cable was cut at Harefield last month and one of the containers near the canal was burgled. This prompted us to review the gate security and we found a mobile welder to repair the gate. This had been damaged by a lorry a few years ago and the cable was a quick fix that lasted years. The welder extended the locking bar so that the

padlock once again fits inside the protective box. Could the first person to arrive, lock the padlock to the gate and then use the combination lock for the day.





We have two locks, the keyed padlock is for when there is no-one there, it's a stronger lock. The combination lock is for when someone is flying at the field. The reason is so that if we need the emergency services we can pass over them the code allowing them to drive all the way up to the Hut. If we didn't use a combination lock, the emergency services would be stuck at the gate or would cut the lock off. In the perfect world we'd send someone down to let them in, but maybe you are there alone or just two of you? Hence why we use a combination lock when people are at the field.

It was a dull day, the Saturday before Christmas, windy and grey. However, a few of the more hardy types were at the field.
